Mr. Mosely comes to HCS with 21 years of experience in education, most recently at USC Upstate in Spartanburg, South Carolina, and at Southside Christian School in Greenville, South Carolina. Mr. Mosely holds a B.S. degree from Liberty University and an M.S. degree in management from the United States Sports Academy.

Mr. Mosely's long-range vision for the school includes expansion of the facilities, including the addition of an outdoor science lab and more classrooms. His desire is to see HCS excel in all areas of education, from academics to arts to athletics. His primary goal is to develop a Biblical worldview in every student. Mr. Mosely states that:

"I believe that God has confirmed my call to this place and has His hand on Hendersonville Christian School. It is my desire that HCS not just survive but thrive in the remaining part of this decade. We will seek to partner with parents who desire a quality Christian education in Henderson County and the surrounding area."
